

"TO THE PROMISED LAND - PT. 5" (Numbers 11-14)

INTRO: We're in a series journeying with the people of God "To The Promised Land", which represents abundant life in Christ (Jn. 10:10; Rom. 8:37). Today we're going to resume our journey (1Cor. 10:11).

Lessons We've Learned So Far:

- 1. Trust and Obey God no matter the circumstances and opposition!
- 2. Let's only move with God's presence!

I. COMPLAINING, IMPARTATION & QUAIL (Num. 11).

- A. The people complained about having no meat (vv. 1-15).
 - 1. God sent a fire that consumed some (v. 1).
 - 2. Moses prayed, and the fire was guenched (v. 2).
 - a. Prayer tempers God's justice with mercy!
 - 3. Moses sought God in despair (vv. 11-15).
 - a. Lack tempts us to give in to unbelief and despair.
- B. An Impartation (vv. 16-30).
 - 1. God put the Spirit that was on Moses on 70 elders so they could help bear the burden.
- C. God sends quail to eat along with a plague (vv. 31-36).

II. FAMILY DYSFUNCTION (Num. 12).

- A. Miriam & Aaron spoke against Moses and Miriam became a leper.
- B. Moses prayed for her, and she was healed.
- C. Can you sincerely pray for the wellbeing of those who have hurt you?

III. 12 SPIES SENT TO THE PROMISED LAND (Num. 13).

- A. God told Moses to send 12 spies, 1 from each of the 12 tribes, to Canaan to spy out the land (vv. 1-20).
- B. The 12 Spies' report (vv. 21-26).
 - 1. 10/12 spies gave a negative report the enemy is formidable.
 - 2. Caleb tried to encourage the people to battle and victory.
 - 3. The 10 spies compared the enemy to themselves rather than God!

IV. THE PEOPLE REFUSE TO ENTER THE PROMISED LAND (Num. 14).

- A. The people complain once again (vv. 1-4).
- B. The response of Moses, Aaron, Joshua & Caleb (vv. 5-9).
- C. God's response (vv. 10-12, 30-38). Only Joshua & Caleb and the younger generation would enter The Promised Land.
 - 1. Fear and unbelief can negatively impact others!
- D. Do you have a Caleb spirit a different spirit than those walking in fear & unbelief (v. 24)?
- E. The presumptuous attack of the Amalekites (vv. 39-45).

CONCLUSION: Let's trust and obey God no matter what opposition we may face! Don't compare your opposition to yourself but to your God!
