

"ACCORDING TO THE ORDER OF MELCHIZEDEK - PART II"

INTRO: Let's continue working our way through the spiritual meat of Hebrews. Today we'll be covering Heb. 7:11-28.

I. There's a New High Priest in the World (Heb. 7:11-19)!

- A. The Levitical priesthood couldn't transform lives (v. 11).
 - 1. Therefore another priesthood was needed one according to the order of Melchizedek, not Aaron.
- B. A change in the priesthood would also require a change in the law, being the law addressed priesthood (v. 12).
- C. Jesus came from the tribe of Judah, not Levi (vv. 13-14).
 - 1. Moses spoke of priests coming from Levi, not Judah.
- D. Jesus didn't come according to any O.T. law, but according to the power of His eternal divine nature and existence (vv. 15-17; Ps. 110:4).
- E. The Old Testament law has been replaced by the New Covenant (vv. 18-19; chapter 8).
 - 1. The O.T. law couldn't transform human hearts.
 - 2. The New Testament brings us a better hope, including being drawn close to God.

II. The Superiority of the New High Priest (Heb. 7:20-28).

- A. The Priesthood and Oaths (vv. 20-21).
 - 1. Jesus was made priest with God's oath of Ps. 110:4.
 - 2. Aaron was made priest without an oath.
 - 3. This signifies the superiority of Jesus' priesthood.
- B. Jesus is guarantor of a better covenant (v. 22; chap. 8).
- C. The O.T. priests all eventually died, but the eternal Jesus serves as our great High Priest forever (vv. 23-24).
- D. Jesus our eternal mediator [intercessor] is able to save us completely (v. 25; 1Tim. 2:5). This doesn't mean praying!
- E. Characteristics of Jesus our High Priest (v. 26; Phil. 2:9-11).
- F. Unlike the O.T. priests, Jesus doesn't need to offer daily sacrifices first for His own sins being He has none (v. 27a).
 - 1. He offered up Himself as a once for all sacrifice (v. 27b).
- G. The law appointed fallible priests, but God's oath appointed the infallible eternal Jesus (v. 28).

CONCLUSION: Jesus our High Priest is far superior to Aaron!
