

## "DEI OR ADONAI?" PT. II

**INTRO:** DEI stands for <u>D</u>iversity, <u>E</u>quity & <u>I</u>nclusion. *"Adonai"* is a Hebrew word for God, which means *"lord"* or *"master."* We should follow Adonai and His ways over secular philosophies (Col. 2:8; Eph. 5:11; Matt. 7:15-20).

## I. DIVERSITY VS. IMPARTIAL OPPORTUNITY

- A. Diversity should happen organically, not mechanically.
- B. Heaven is diverse (Rev. 7:9) because God is impartial and offers heaven to "whosoever will" (Jn. 3:16; Rom. 10:13).

## II. EQUITY VS. BEING REWARDED ACCORDING TO WORKS

- A. Dictionary: "the quality of being fair and impartial."
- B. Good if it's equal opportunity for the equally qualified.
- C. Equity is bad if by equity we mean forced equal outcomes regardless of performance (socialism).
- D. What does the Bible say about equity? God rewards everyone according to their works (Rev. 22:12).
- E. The Parable of the Talents (Matt. 25:14-30).
  - 1. Each steward was given different amounts based on their ability rather than equity (vv. 14-15).
  - 2. Each was rewarded according to their performance, not according to equity (vv. 21-30).

## III. INCLUSION VS. KOINONIA

- A. What is Inclusion? The practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized.
  - 1. Inclusion typically has boundaries and limitations.
- B. What does the Bible say about inclusion?
  - 1. "koinonia" is the Greek word translated "fellowship" and means sharing in common or partnership.
  - 2. Koinonia is based on values/practices held in common.
  - 3. Scriptures (Acts 2:40-42; Rom. 16:17; 1Cor. 5:1-13; 2Cor. 6:14-18; 1Jn. 1:7; 2Jn. 1:7-11). Biblical inclusion excludes those who don't share the common values.

**CONCLUSION:** DEI as it is being practiced today is bearing bad fruit and therefore should be rejected and replaced with biblical truth.
