REVIEW/INTRO: Paul warned us about a time when people would not endure sound doctrine but would instead surround themselves with teachers who would tell them what they wanted to hear rather than what they needed to hear (2Tim. 4:3-5). Paul specifically warned of a time when people would be deceived by *“Doctrines of Demons”* (1Tim. 4:1-2).

CONTEMPORARY DOCTRINES OF DEMONS:

1. Creation & Faith vs. Evolution & Atheism.
2. Mankind’s Mandate vs. Overpopulation and The Climate Crisis.
3. God’s Creation & Definition of Family vs. Culture’s.

4. Serving God vs. Serving a Pagan Culture (1Cor. 7:23).

- A. We’re called by God to serve Him only and not become slaves of men.
- B. Our culture is trying to make all of us slaves of the global elite - the fruit of doctrines of demons.

SLAVERY STRATEGIES [used by the global elite]:

1. Deceive us into giving in to doctrines of demons.
2. Lull us away from knowing and believing the Bible, and from holding to biblical moral standards.
3. Deceive us into devaluing human life.
4. To promote a one-world government takeover of our lives.

•People Ruling Over Us Who:

- A. We have not voted in.
- B. Despise Christianity.
- C. Despise the U.S. Constitution.
- D. Despise the private ownership of property (except for themselves).
- E. Their Motto: *“You’ll own nothing and be happy.”*

What The Bible Says About These Things (1Cor. 7:23).

- A. We’re called to resist all efforts to bring us into slavery, regardless of who it is.
- B. Slavery and the History of God’s People in Egypt (Genesis, Exodus, & Joshua).
 1. God’s people became slaves in Egypt.
 2. God’s will was to lead His children out of slavery and into the Promised Land where they would be free from Pagan slavery.
 3. This is still God’s will for His children (Ex. 3:7-8)!
- C. Scriptures (Ex. 1:5-17; 2:23; 3:7-8; 16:2-3; Num. 14:1-4; Josh. 9:1-27).
 1. A growing, united, free-thinking people are a threat to the Pagan elite.
 2. The Pagan elite tried to enslave the people, because an enslaved people are easier to control.
 3. The Pagan elite have little value for human life.
 4. We’re called to stand up for what is right, regardless of the cost.
 5. People often trade their freedoms and resources for the false security of slavery so they don’t have to walk by faith and trust God.
- D. The Nature of Slavery (Judges 8:22-23; 9:1-15).
 1. It’s man ruling over us rather than God.
 2. It settles for incompetent and immoral leaders.
- E. Israel Demands a King (1Sam. 8:4-20).
 1. To be like the pagan nations.
 2. It is a rejection of God’s rule!
 3. It comes at a high price!
